Before the Easter holidays I ran some Easter activity sessions. This year, rather than focusing on one or two year groups, I had several schools ask for sessions to be run with different classes. So I ended up working with EYFS. Year 3 & 4 classes and in a special needs school with mixed age groups.

I thought of doing something different with each of them but Trish introduced me to a great resource, a pass the parcel Easter story game. I decided to try it in all the schools, tweaking it slightly for each setting. They all absolutely loved it!

They were all fully engaged taking in the whole story. In some of the classes, we didn't even get time to move onto the creative response because they were so engrossed with the story itself and asking so many deep questions that we explored together.

It was truly beautiful to see the way the activity was wholeheartedly embraced by the pupils and staff.

In one school, one of the boys who had taken part in a Christmas activity session that we had run was overjoyed when the music stopped and he was holding the box. He got to open it and showed everyone what part of the story was inside. Afterwards his teacher told me how the Christmas activity session had really helped his communication and confidence as he had told his family and others all about it. He was so excited that he would be able to take part in an Easter activity session too. She was hopeful that it would be just as beneficial to him especially since he got to open a box!


In another school, the pupils had been learning about Pentecost and spent ages discussing how it linked to the story of Holy Week. They were so excited to be able to share with me what they had learnt.

- In May, we will be supporting Lifepath, this year being held in Olney and looking at the life and times of John Newton. Nearly 1,000 children will be taking part over 3 days, many of whom come from Bedfordshire schools. Please pray for the leadership team, the volunteers, the weather and most importantly for the schools that will be attending.
- Later in the term, we are planning some activities related to Prayer Spaces. We hope to have the opportunity to work with Scripture Union and some of the schools to pilot a new resource supporting pupils with prayer spaces. We'll keep you posted but please pray that the schools that we approach will be open to allowing us to try out this resource and pray for Scripture Union as they develop it further.
 - Towards the end of term, we will be running some 'It's Your Move' transition activities for Year 6 pupils. These will include workshops, prayer and reflection spaces and extended assemblies. Please pray for the Year 6 pupils as they navigate the next steps of their school life journey. Please also pray for the staff that will be supporting them through this time and for us as we offer them a chance to reflect and think more deeply about how best to handle this time.
