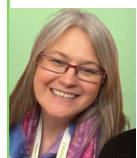

## Trish



Becky and I got to deliver Easter Activity sessions the week after the Easter Experience in our various schools. We used an Easter 'Pass the parcel' game where each box contained a part of the Easter story. We also led storytelling using Out of the Box resources followed by a creative response from the children. The children engaged well, reflected on the story and asked great questions. Feedback from a teacher: **"They had a lovely time completing their projects and I noticed some great collaboration amongst some groups."**

Assemblies were on the value of empathy focusing on Christ's humanity and how he can relate to our emotions of sadness, temptation, betrayal, rejection, suffering and fear.

# Easter Experience 2025

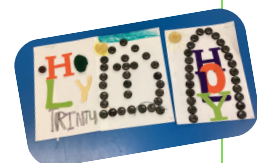

## Holy Trinity RE Workshops

We had an amazing time running the Holy Trinity RE Workshops. We visited 9 schools across Bedfordshire, working with around 370 children.

It was a very profound subject to try to explain to pupils in Years 3 & 4 (per the curriculum this topic is to be taught to this age group) but Trish and Becky had an amazing team of 11 people join them for planning and delivery of the workshops. The team came from a variety of denominations and backgrounds which really helped us give a well rounded presentation and the feedback from the schools was great. The children had the opportunity to creatively respond to what they had experienced and it was incredible to see how deeply some of them were thinking.
